Rose Conway Flanagan Traditional Irish Fiddler from Pearl River, New York. Her students have included several All-Ireland winners and medalists. She has been an instructor at the

Alaskan Traditional Music Camp, Catskills Irish Arts Week, The Swannanoa Celtic Gathering, the O'Flaherty Irish Music Retreat in the US, DeDanaan Camp in Vancouver, BC, and Scoile Eigse in Cavan, Ireland. Rose has taught workshops at the NE Tional, CCE conventions and at the Musical Heritage Center. Rose and flutist, Laura Byrne, have just released a new recording "Forget Me Not, Traditional Irish Music On Fiddle And Flute."



Maeve Flanagan was born to a family of Irish tradition: her parents (Mike and Rose) are both accomplished fiddlers. She studied fiddle from her mother and her Uncle, Brian Conway. At age 11, Maeve won All Ireland Under 12

Fiddle Competition. She is also an accomplished tin whistle player & has numerous medals from Ireland Fleadh Cheoils and US Mid-Atlantic Fleadh Cheoils. Her group, "Girsa," performs all over the U.S. A composer who also loves to blend trad Irish with a modern twist, she has been an instructor at Catskills Irish Arts Week in NY, O'Flaherty Youth Camp in Texas, Augusta Irish Heritage Week and currently teaches fiddle & whistle in Pearl River. Maeve just graduated from law school in May and is now a licensed attorney.



Eamonn Dillon Born in West Belfast, Northern Ireland, uillleann piper & whistle player, Eamonn has toured and recorded as a solo artist & with a varied group of performers, touring shows and bands throughout the

U.S., Canada & Europe. Additionally his music has been featured on several film & television programs around the world. He has performed and recorded as a featured artist in traditional, theatrical and mixed genre ensembles, including Needfire, John McDermott, The Irish Tenors and Celtic Bridge. Eamonn first learned the tin whistle from his father & Tara Diamond. The great master Sean McAloon made his first set of uilleann pipes, and mentored him while starting out.



Pauline Conneely was born in Bedford, England to Irish immigrants hailing from Connemara

and County Longford. Her parents passed their love of Irish music on to Pauline and her brothers and sisters. They studied with Brendan Mulkere, originally from County Clare, who filled their house with music when he came to teach. Pauline came to America in 1988 as a dancer and musician with Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann and moved to Chicago in 1989. She is one of the finest Irish banjo players in America.



John Walsh was born in the Bronx. NY - otherwise known as Ireland's 33rd county. At the age of 10, his

family moved to Kilkenny, Éire where he took up guitar and was lucky enough to be surrounded by a rich musical heritage and learned a variety of musical styles. John currently runs St. Canice's Backyard, his recording studio, and performs with his band, Jameson's Revenge.



John Mock A native of Connecticut's eastern shore, John's work has taken him around the world. Widely

sought after as a composer, arranger and multi-instrumentalist, he has worked with such notable artists as Nanci Griffith, Maura O'Connell, Kathy Mattea & Mark O'Connor. His orchestral arrangements have been performed by orchestras throughout America and abroad, including the London, National, Atlanta and Nashville Symphonies.



Tim May has toured with Patty Loveless, Eddie Rabbitt, and has been a regular on the Opry with Mike Snider's

OldTime String Band. He was voted Nashville Reader's Poll Best Instrumentalist in Nashville in 2012, and in the Top 3 in 2013. Tim played on Charlie Daniels' 2005 track of 'I'll Fly Away', a song nominated that year for Country Instrumental Grammy. He co-authored The Flatpicker's Guide to Irish Music.

yrs. She played in a bagpipe band 18 years then moved towards a more free form of drumming...teaching herself the bodhran and learning buttonbox accordian. Suzi's dance background & love of rhythm enables her to teach folks how to make the Bodhran talk! Her sweetie, 'Chef Benito' is the cook in charge for this weekend. The couple recently moved from Alaska to the warmer climate of Gladwin, Michigan.



Julie Mavity-Hudson & Eddy Hudson play in the Fiddle & Pick Ceili Band and Nashville Irish Sessions. Julie plays Irish flute, Irish whistle, cello and claw hammer banjo and is a budding piper. Eddy plays fiddle, flute, bodhran and djembe. They also help host the MHC Irish Sessions and local contra dances.

Class Levels Explained

Total Beginner: no experience at all or those who play some but are not yet comfortable with the basics

- **I Beginner:** some proficiency with the instrument; can tune instrument; can pick up small phrases by ear; can play up to a dozen tunes (in any style)
- II Intermediate: mastered basic skills; can tune instrument; can pick up phrases easily by ear; keep time; play the principle scales & chords cleanly; know how to play tunes with confidence; basic ornamentation and familiarity with the Irish genre; understands and plays several jigs and reels
- III Advanced: comfortable with instrument and able to focus on style, arrangement and left- and right-hand ornamentation and able to play many jigs and reels with confidence. Fiddlers should be experienced in bowing ornamentation, bowing rhythms and variations. Remember - being be an expert in another genre of music doesn't necessarily mean you are ready for an advanced Irish class.



CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Levels: I beginner

II intermediate



IRISH FIDDLE LEVELS I, II, III Rose Flanagan & Maeve Flanagan

Rose and Maeve teach Sligo style bowings, left-hand ornaments & variations on a variety of reels, jigs, slip jigs, hornpipes & polkas. Tunes are taught by ear in segments and handouts will be available.

TENOR BANJO / MANDOLIN LEVELS I, II, III Pauline Conneely / Tim May / Karl Kersey

LEVEL 1, PAULINE Basic learning of how to hold your banjo or mandolin properly (comfortably) also how to place fingers on the right fret. Learning the scale and possibly the beginning of a polka!

LEVEL II, PAULINE This is where I bring in the use of solid rhythm with the right hand and work on plectrum holding to get the most natural swing. Jigs would be the choice of tune for this lesson—slow and steady.

LEVEL III, PAULINE We will work on a harder reel and make sure it flows evenly from start to finish. Correct fingering and notes, with plectrum hand to compliment the other hand. Mandolin taught at same time.

LEVELS I & II, TIM Understanding tune structures. Gaining knowledge of patterns and technique help make learning by ear a bit easier. We will break down reels and look at what they're made of. Scales, folded scales, arpeggios, triplets; quick introduction to modes.

LEVEL III, TIM will teach right- and left-hand techniques for playing Irish ornaments and jigs; and discuss modes.

LEVEL I, KARL Tune workshop with Irish stylings for mandolin & banjo.

BODHRAN/IRISH DRUM FROM SCRATCH Suzi Fowley Perri

Always wanted to play the Bodhran but don't know where to start? This class is for total beginners. Learn how to correctly hold the drum and tipper. Learn how to recognize a jig from a reel and bodhran etiquette. Drums provided and are available for purchase. Included will be a lesson on how to say bodhran the right way! Have some fun. I will provide handouts for students.

BODHRAN/IRISH DRUM MULTI-LEVEL Suzi Fowley Perri

Looking to learn some new licks on you bodhran? Come to this "What you don't know about the bodhran" class. You'll learn to get outside the box on your drum and incorporate some great percussion into the sessions.

BODHRAN/IRISH DRUM LEVEL II Eddy Hudson

Different rhythms covered; jig, slipjig, reels, polkas, hornpipes and other opposite hand techniques.

IRISH WHISTLE FROM SCRATCH Julie Mavity-Hudson

This class is for total beginners who have been curious about the tin whistle and are ready to dive in! We will discuss and experiment with the Irish style or approach to playing the whistle, focusing on breathing, phrasing and ornamentation. (Affordable whistles will be available for purchase.)

IRISH WHISTLE LEVEL II Eamonn Dillon

This class is intended for those who are currently playing the whistle and want to move further into areas related to repertoire and technique. We will listen to some of the great whistle players and discuss what elements they bring to playing and how they might enhance our own approach to whistle playing.

Instructors reserve the right to reassign a student's class level. Classes for total beginners only where specified. Audio recording devices are highly recommended.

UILLEANN PIPING Eamonn Dillon

The class will cover all aspects of the instrument including bellows technique, maintaining proper pressure in the bag, tone and tuning, fingering, phrasing and ornamentation. We will also talk about music repertoire as it relates to the pipes. Class participants are encouraged to bring audio recording devices.

CONCERTINA John Mock

Basic concertina workshop for those with a concertina who want to learn how to unlock it's potential for learning tunes, chordal accompaniment and some Irish stylings.

GUITAR:

With these classes, you must first have fluent chord to chord flow with the left hand and at least basic rhythm with the pick hand. These classes are not for beginners, some are more advanced than others. They will give you the tools needed to make progress — no matter your level.

JOHN MOCK: GUITAR ACCOMPANIMENT 1 & 2 (STD)

Multi level. John plays many styles but is known for his Irish flavor when playing with artists. Instruction in Irish guitar stylings & techniques used with other musical styles as well.

GUITAR ACCOMPANIMENT & SOLOING 1 & 2 (STD) Multi level

Guitar 1 & 2 do not indicate a proficiency level. They refer to the first day/ second day of the workshop. They are different classes with continuing ideas and techniques. You don't need to take the Gtr 1 class before taking Gtr 2. You can attend any or all of John Mock's classes without feeling lost or repeating a class.



JOHN WALSH: INTRO TO DADGAD GUITAR

For the guitar player who wants to learn this alternative tuning that is so popular and energizing for accompanying Irish music. It's also useful in other genres as well.

DADGAD GTR: HOW TO ACCOMPANY IRISH MUSIC

John will teach you creative approaches to accompany traditional Irish music—whether intrumental or vocal. Multi-level.

INTER TO ADV FINGERPICKING IRISH TUNES — DADGAD

You will learn how to play Irish tune melodies with your fingers—not a pick. A nice soloistic approach to add to your arsenal.

INTER TO ADV DADGAD GUITAR

Continuing accompaniment and/or fingerpicking style and if time, open topics suggested by students.
