Considered one of the state's finest living fiddlers, Robert Townsend moved to Tennessee when he was 10 years old. His new neighborhood in South Pittsburg was home to a family that played fiddle, banjo, guitar, and mandolin. He was immediately fascinated. Another neighbor showed Robert guitar chords. Several years later he traded his guitar and \$10 for a fiddle, and has been playing ever

since. Robert honed his playing by sitting and watching many regional fiddlers he traveled to meet, and from listening to recordings, both homemade tapes and commercial albums. Among his biggest influences was Charles Higgins, who helped him understand and replicate the playing of Grundy County fiddler Oscar Overturf (b. 1900 d. 1988). Robert also spent time with fiddlers Bryson Higgins (Charles's cousin), Clint Kilgore, Clyde Stephens and Don Stoker. Robert has also performed extensively with the Fiery Gizzard String Band, and released with the group the album Old Time Fiddlin' Tunes From The South Cumberland.



David Johnson has extensive professional experience in the Classical, Country, Jazz, Bluegrass, Irish, and Old Time styles, and loves them all. As a Fiddler, Mr. Johnson toured with Country Music artist Randy Travis for 27 years. He has played Square Dances and Contradances for many years. He is a member of NOTSBA (Nashville Old Time String Band Association), enjoys weekly jams in person and online, and is always ready to learna new tune. As a Violinist, he performs with the Paducah KY, Jackson, and Murfreesboro TN Symphonies, and plays with several chamber music groups on a regular basis.



Dave Dillard was "encouraged" to start playing banjo in high school when his father noticed that football practice was not going so well. After graduating engineering school at Clemson University, Dave moved to Nashville, Tennessee, where he played in bands with the likes of Vasser Clements,

Kenny Baker, Josh Graves, and others. Dave ran a local non-profit for 25 years, and in 2018 transitioned back to music to start the Nashville Banjo Company where he works to hand-craft custom heirloom quality open-back banjos and teach clawhammer-style playing. Alan O'Bryant is best known as a singer, songwriter, & banjo player with The Nashville Bluegrass Band. He also plays & teaches oldtime mandolin. A two-time Grammy winner originally from Reidsville, NC, his career in Nashville spans some fortyplus years of recording, producing, teaching and performing

worldwide. His appearances have included workshop classes on banjo technique & instrument set-up, vocal & band performance dynamics at venues including; Sewanee Banjo Camp, Augusta Heritage Center Elkins WV, American Banjo Camp (Seattle), and Nashcamp in Cumberland Furnace, TN.



Tim May toured with Patty Loveless, & Eddie Rabbitt, & has played The Grand Old Opry with Mike Snider's band . He was voted Nashville Reader's Poll Best Instrumentalist in Nashville in

2012, and in the Top 3 in 2013. Tim played on Charlie Daniels' 2005 track of 'I'll Fly Away', which was nominated for Country Instrumental Grammy. He performed at Carnegie Hall in 2017. Tim plays mandolin, mandola and mandocello on the recording PLAIDGRASS among many other recordings. He co-authored The Flatpicker's Guide to Irish Music, The Flatpicker's Guide to Old Time Music, The Mandolin Player's Practical Guide to Scales and Arpeggios, the eight volume series Flatpicking Essentials, and is in demand as a roots music teacher including The Swannanoa Gathering's Guitar Week and Song Week.





Erinn Peet Lukes is a singer, guitarist, songwriter and teacher originally from Redondo Beach, California. She moved to Seattle in 2008 and NYC in 2011, where she cut her teeth at open mics and busking in subway stations. In 2013, she moved to Denver and formed a bluegrass band called Thunder and Rain. The band toured the US, Ireland, and the UK in it's seven years run. Bluegrass's influence helped shape her flatpick-style guitar playing that compliments her lilting voice and catchy melodies. Her original songwriting awarded her placements at the KerrvilleNew Folk Contest in 2018 and the Merlefest

Songwriting Competition in 2021. Thunder and Rain disbanded in 2020 and she moved to Nashville, Tennessee. She began teaching guitar, ukulele and voice at the Fiddle and Pick in January 2021. She also recorded her second solo EP with a top-notch team and will be releasing it in March.

In 2008 she founded the Musical Heritage Center,

AKA... the Fiddle & Pick. As MHC Director, she hosts traditional music events featuring workshops and concerts by expert instructors. She teaches private lessons and regularly leads inclusive multilevel jams, sessions and classes. Gretchen loves playing driving fiddle tunes for dances, especially flatfootin' and Irish step dancers. She currently plays Irish fiddle with "The Nashville Irish Trio"; Eamonn Dillon (pipes & whistle) and Robert Johnson (guitar & bouzouki). Recently toured with eclectic bluegrass artist, Erinn Peet Lukes, and mandolinist, Emily Wilson. The EPL trio are music educators and hosted Kids Music Day Camp at MHC Summer 2021. Gretchen's love for traditional music (Irish, Bluegrass and Appalachian Old-Time), inspired her to form her ensemble, "PLAIDGRASS".
