TAUGHT BY



Bob Townsend is considered one of Tennessee's finest living fiddlers. His neighborhood in South Pittsburg was home to a family that played fiddle, banjo,

guitar, and mandolin. He was instantly fascinated. He has been playing ever since. Bob honed his knowledge of the South Cumberland's regional repertoires and styles by visiting and watching many older regional fiddlers, as well as from listening closely to rare homemade tapes and commercial albums. His biggest influences was Charles Higgins, who taught him tunes from Grundy County fiddler Oscar Overturf (1900–1988). Bob has performed extensively with the Fiery Gizzard String Band.



Alan O'Bryant Alan's uncles and cousins were all into oldtime music and what they called "string music." Alan picked up the banjo at age 13,

and took to it instantly. He learned by listening to records and watching his cousin play. His uncle quickly recognized Alan's potential. "He'd come get me and take me with him to a dance," where they would perform with a group of old-timers and split the earnings. He was an huge fan of Bill Monroe's since he was a kid and got to be a Blue Grass Boy. Monroe was a huge influence on him; their friendship continued until Bill's death. Alan has taught numerous banjo camps, including the Banjo Institute Clinic, and NashCamp. Alan is very rooted in old-time music, playing mandolin, and teaches mandolin, guitar and banjo.



George Guthrie a talented Nashville-based banjo player (both 3-finger bluegrass and old time clawhammer style) and singer. He is best known for his

touring and recording with The Wooks, but is also an in-demand sideman with various other bands and projects. He toured as the principal banjoist with the Broadway show written by Steve Martin and Edie Brickell. George once played over 150 shows in 8 cities over a 9-month period.



Amy Alvey is an award winning fiddler, singer and songwriter who tours the country as half of the duo Golden Shoals. She's a Berklee graduate who's spent

the better part of a decade immersed in the old-time scene, performing and picking into the wee hours at the nation's fiddle gatherings and music festivals. She's won ribbons in traditional fiddling contests such as Clifftop, Mount Airy, Galax, Surrey County, and the Grand Masters Fiddlers Championship. She hosts the weekly Sunday night old-time jam at Fran's Eastside Lounge in Nashville.



Tim May toured with Patty Loveless, Eddie Rabbitt, and Kathy Mattea and played The Grand Old Opry with Mike Snider's band. He was

voted Nashville Reader's Poll Best Instrumentalist in Nashville in 2012, and in the Top 3 in 2013. Tim played on Charlie Daniels' 2005 track of 'I'll Fly Away', (nominated for Country Instrumental Grammy). He co-authored The Flatpicker's Guide to Irish Music, The Flatpicker's Guide to Old Time Music, The Mandolin Player's Practical Guide to Scales and Arpeggios, the eight volume series Flatpicking Essentials, and is in demand as a roots music teacher including The Swananoa Gathering's Guitar Week and Song Week.



Jodi Harbin is a career musician who teaches mandolin, guitar, banjo and bass. She was the founder of the Colorado bluegrass

band, Lonesome Traveler, and has continued her involvement in the bluegrass community after moving to the Knoxville area. She now performs with several groups including the Museum of Appalachia Band, Evie Andrus Band, and with her husband Tim Harbin. Working with Steve Kaufman at his camp every summer and teaching camps throughout the US has exposed her to a wide range of teachers and teaching materials on all the bluegrass instruments.

Erinn Peet Lukes has a pure, angelic voice and bluegrass-inspired sensibilities. She makes music that crosses genres

with melodies that are fun and memorable. After years touring with her bluegrass band Thunder and Rain, she moved to Nashville. In her decade long career, Erinn has shared the stage with great songwriters such as Jennifer Knapp and John Paul White of the Civil Wars. Her songwriting has gotten her placed in the Kerrville New Folk Competition (2018) and the Merlefest Chris Austin Songwriting Competition (2021). In 2021 she graced the stage of the world famous Station Inn in Nashville, TN. Her band, Thunder and Rain, has a brand new release and currently touring.



Gretchen Priest is founder, & director of the Musical Heritage Center, aka Fiddle & Pick. She teaches Oldtime, Irish, Bluegrass fiddle

and other styles through private lessons, classes and hosts inclusive Traditional music jams/ sessions. She recently released a new record, "Roadside Distraction", with mandolinist Emily Wilson (Old-time, Irish & wacky modern tunes). She also currently plays with The Nashville Irish Trio (Eamonn Dillon, Robert Johnson), Erinn Peet-Lukes, and also her long-time band, PLAIDGRASS. She has been on staff at many music camps, toured with Ceili Rain, Crucial Smith, played the Grand Ole Opry, and for many Nashville Artists; and played for the Pope!

Orientation page!: for Eighth Of January Old-Time Music Weekend Essential things to know and Questions Answered:

The Layout of the grounds; There are three buildings for the event:

- 1. Fiddle & Pick, aka... The Musical Heritage Center (only enter front door)
- 2. Pegram Community Club "PCC", aka... Pegram Station (across the Street)
- 3. First Baptist Church of Pegram (Enter at Church carport entrance) It is located behind the residence, behind Fiddle & Pick; It is less than a 5 min walk; the long driveway takes you directly to the carport entrance. Plenty of parking front & back ~All three buildings are in walking distance. You can drive if you want; but no need to...We have a volunteer shuttle Shepherd. A simple text gets you and your instruments to and fro!
- ~ All three buildings have 2 bathrooms and parking. The Church and PCC have more parking than Fiddle & Pick.

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m NOTE}$: We try not to use the next-door neighbor's business parking lot; When they are open. The Mud Puddle Pottery and art studios need their lot. Use if they are closed.

~ We recommend you use the bathroom at the PCC or the Church *before you head over to Fiddle & Pick* to prevent long bathroom lines at Fiddle & Pick.

What does EOJ OT Weekend cost to attend?

This year's EOJ Old-Time Music Weekend is **\$25** admission for each day (Fri \$25; Sat \$25) Your admission includes: The All Instruments Tune WS with Bob, A Buckdance WS with Hilary, an informal Instructors Concert, and access to all the Jams. **Wear Name Badge at All Times! Other classes offered:** \$25 fee per person for each class; a "one class minimum" per day. Fiddle, Guitar, Mandolin, Clawhammer Banjo, Traditional Song Circle are offered both days.

How we accommodate Class Levels:

- ~Higher Level Classes (Intermediate-Advanced) are taking place while the Slower/Mid-Tempo Jams are taking place.
- ~ Lower Level Classes (Newer Players/Intermediate) are taking place while the faster jams are taking place.
- ~ unfortunately, there are NO classes for total beginners because we don't have enough rooms.
- ~Make note that we do teach all levels and ages year-round at the center including total beginners!
- ~We try our best to accommodate lots of jamming!
- ~ Traditional Song Circle and the Buckdancing class is "all levels" no experience needed. Also all are welcome to try or observe The ALL Instruments Tune WS.

FOOD? Drink?~Fiddle & Pick has light concessions (snacks & beverages \$1). ~For **Lunch time** you can go into Bellevue (15 min drive) where there is a variety of restaurants. There is a food truck on the way there. Bring a sack lunch and dine at PCC. You may store items in the PCC Fridge (across the street from Fiddle & Pick). There is an oven with a stove top and a microwave. Lots of tables, chairs and restrooms. ~Whether you have carry-out food, or a sack lunch; **PLEASE eat all meals at PCC, instead of Fiddle & Pick**. After all, Mealtime is a goodtime hang out! Enjoy!

~ Supper Time on both <u>Fri & Sat</u>: Potluck Central at the Pegram Station! If possible, bring an item to share. ~ We will provide Coffee, Tea, Water, plates, bowls, cups, plastic ware & Naps, and good vibes at PCC! See you on the funway!

What you should know about Jam Etiquette at EOJ Old-Time Weekend. Page 2 Great tips that are helpful to everyone!

- **~Tune your instrument** before you enter any Jam. (Its good to have a tuner and an instrument that will tune up). Sometimes new strings are needed.
- ~Play in one key for awhile before switching keys.(There are reasons for this).
- **~Don't play loud all the time**. Vary your volume in tunes. "Beating & sawing" approach is not desirable but there are times when its racous .
- ~We recommend taking turns picking out a tune for all to play; This way everyone gets a chance to pick a tune. Review a tune you learned in class. NOTE: It is good idea to "say the name of the tune out loud" that you are about to start, especially at a large jam! Sharing the name is so helpful! Everyone is learning. It is hard to hear the start; folks far away from you will really appreciate knowing what tune you are launching!
- ~ When the jam is playing a tune that you don't know yet; LISTEN to it a round *before* trying to play it. This is good for everyone. After listening for a time, start to play it softly and keep listening while picking up more of it.
- ~Do Not clutter the Jam Area with your instrument cases. Just bring your instrument in the jam. Use the tables for cases. Consolidate your personal items by putting things in your case like keys, wallet, purse, books, coat, gloves, etc...that easily get lost at an event.
- ~ Please don't move chairs that are set up to accommodate a large jam. **Chairs are set up to maximize seating space for a jam.** Always, more folks will arrive. Remember this: <u>The undesirable</u>, "one wide circle" makes it impossible for a large group to stay together on the beat. Rhythm is King.
- "The onion, or "layered circles" work best for a large group to play together. Smaller jams are welcome to spring up in other rooms.

Musical Heritage Center aka... a building called...."Fiddle & Pick": ~ Keep it tidy!

- ~Drinks go on the little tables, instead of the floor where they get kicked.
- ~When you leave the jamming area, *Please* take all of your items with you (including your trash & drinks)

NEVER pick up someone's instrument and play it without asking them first. Also don't be shocked if they say "No". They have the right to say No.

When in classes, please keep conversation short and no noodling! Get more out or the session. Play Nice. Enjoy! Hope these tips are helpful. Sending this with Love, not meant mean spirited or unkind tone.
